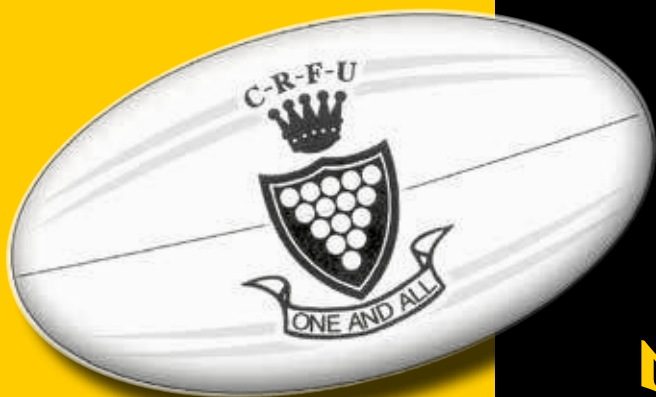

SECTION 2: YOUTH RUGBY

GUIDELINES FOR AGE GROUP MATCHES including COUNTY GAMES, KNOCK-OUT CUP FINALS & FESTIVALS

Both the Age Group and the Host Club have clear responsibilities for the success of the day, but it is the duty of the Age Group to ensure there is good liaison between the two to achieve this. Whilst most of the points are obvious to the experienced administrator, the aim is to provide a checklist which perhaps new administrators will find helpful.

A. Responsibilities of the Age Group

1. To make the initial contact with the Host Club and to discuss with them the following arrangements **where appropriate**:-
 - (a) manning the gate and admission charges.
 - (b) sale of programmes.
 - (c) car parking.
 - (d) public address system.
 - (e) catering requirements and method of payment.
 - (f) availability of bar.
 - (g) availability of St. Johns Ambulance.
2. To provide medical cover by:-
 - (a) ensuring that St. Johns Ambulance is in attendance (see 1g. above).
 - (b) providing a qualified First Aider, together with fully equipped First Aid box.
 - (c) nominating a person to act as hospital car service.
3. To provide kit, including spares for the team.
4. To host the opposition during their stay at the ground.
5. To ensure the maximum financial return on the event through:-
 - (a) match advertising - posters, press, radio and T.V.
 - (b) sponsorship.
 - (c) charging admission.
 - (d) programme sales.

B. Responsibilities of the Host Club

1. To liaise with the Age Group as per A.1 above
2. To ensure preparation and marking of pitch(es), provision of flags, water bucket and sponge, balls, oranges.
3. To ensure changing rooms are clean and showers are working.

C. Responsibility of the Cornwall R.F.U.

1. All clubs are reminded to bring a qualified first aider with their team on match day. Should you have difficulties in this regard, please contact Tony Knightsbridge at least 48 hours prior to your match on 07944:731625.

RULES OF THE CORNWALL RFU YOUTH COMPETITIONS

These rules apply to all league and cup competitions for 16s and Colts.

ADDITION FOR SEASON 22-23 - DISCIPLINE

With the reported rise in cases of match official abuse from parents, spectators, and coaches we feel we need to do more to promote and enforce the values of our game.

Therefore, in addition to the normal discipline process the competitions committee reserve the right to penalise teams by way of points deduction for league games and forfeiting wins in cup matches. It is all of our responsibility to come down heavy of cases of ill discipline and lack of respect and we will sanction any cases that are reported to us.

1. The competition shall be known as the Cornwall RFU knockout Cup or league Competition and shall be open to all clubs in membership with the Cornwall RFU. Clubs wishing to enter must inform the Youth Competition Secretary by the 1st of August.
2. Cornwall RFU committee shall appoint a Youth Competition Secretary Who shall run all competitions and have the final decision on any conflicts. An appeal on the competitions secretary's decision must be put in writing to the Youth Chairman within 7 days of the decision for the Youth committee to discuss.
3. The competitions Secretary shall decide upon the format, depending on the number of teams entered and a draw made accordingly.
The Competition Secretary shall issue results of the draw, including dates of matches to participating clubs.
4. Matches will normally be played on the weekend of the dates stated in the draw. However mid-week/floodlight games are permissible provided mutually agreed to overcome any fixture problems. Should a club need to alter a scheduled date they must contact the Youth Competition Secretary 3 weeks prior to the scheduled date. Should the reason for postponement be granted, the Youth Competition Secretary will reschedule the game within 4 weeks of the original date. Failure to accept the Secretary's decision may result in a penalty.
5. Players must have a current registration with their respective clubs and a valid photo ID card ready to be inspected if required at all cup and league matches, any players playing out of age grade must have the necessary paperwork completed and the opposition informed 24 hours before kick-off, the. All players, including replacements, are deemed cup tied once they appear in a league or cup fixture.

team sheets are provided by the Youth Competition Secretary, they will include players name, date of birth and RFU registration number. A player who is not a registered member of any club participating in the competition may join, providing he does

register. Any player wishing to Join another club and is not cup tied (3 games or less) may do so with the relevant "COP" (player transfer request) completed and signed off, no registered player may transfer after the deadline date which is the 1st of March without express permission from the CRFU youth committee. Any players not covered by the above regarding eligibility must prior to appearing in the competition contact the Youth Competition Secretary.

6. Should a pitch be deemed unplayable within 24 hours of the kick off, a local member of the Cornwall Referees Society must be asked to confirm this decision. The opponents and the Youth Competition Secretary must be notified immediately. The Youth Competition Secretary will reschedule the game, Failure to accept the Secretary's decision will result in points or game deduction for the offending club.

7. All games shall have a duration of (age grade) minutes each way, with no extra time to be played at any stage of the competition. In the event of an abandoned match, for whatever reason, the result must be notified to the Youth Competition Secretary. The Youth Competition Committee / discipline committee will make the final decision.

8. Points for pool matches will be awarded as follows:

4 points for a win

2 points for a draw

1 bonus point for a team scoring four or more tries

1 bonus point for a team losing by 7 points or more

Should a game not be played, with no fault attributed

to either side, then 2 points will be awarded to both. Where a club concedes a

game and does not play as a friendly they will be deducted 5 points and their opponents will be

awarded 5 points, should a club withdraw from the Competition, the

points together with for and against scores in matches already played

shall be removed from their opponent's total. Pool positions will be determined

firstly, by the number of pool points accrued. In the event of a tie, the pool

position will be determined by points scored and points conceded. Should there

still be a tie then the result of the game between the two teams will count.

9. Should a team be short of players, their opponents should attempt to loan their

players. Any loaned player will not be cup tied. Failure to agree this compromise

will result in the game being played with reduced numbers on both teams

(minimum of 10 players). Both teams MUST play with equal numbers always except for a yellow or red card being issued by the referee.

Substitutes: unlimited rolling substitutions with unlimited interchanges permitted, all substitutes must play for at least 35 minutes, the RFU age grade "half time rule" will apply to all cup and league games.

we strongly advise that substitutes be used in a fair and even way, if a team has 15 or less players the opposition are encouraged to use their substitutes on both sides giving every player game time and playing in the "spirit" of the game.

10. Positions in the qualifying stages (if any) of the competition shall be based firstly on the group points awarded (as 9 above). Should there be a tie then the difference between match points for and against shall count. If still equal then by the results of the game between the two teams, and if still equal, then by the total number of tries scored.

In the knockout stages of the competition, should teams be level at full time the

team scoring the most tries shall be deemed the winner. If equal, then the team

with most conversions shall win, and if still equal, the team scoring the first try shall be

deemed the winner.

11. The finals of the competition will be played at a venue organised by the competitions committee; the date of the finals WILL NOT be changed to accommodate clubs. Should a game end in a draw, the side with the most tries will be deemed the winner. If level, the side scoring the most conversions will be deemed the winner, if still level, the teams will share the trophy.

12. For all matches in the competition, the Cornwall Referees Society shall appoint a referee. Should no appointed referee be available clubs should mutually agree to obtain a suitable qualified/trained replacement. If a suitable replacement is agreed this must be noted on the team sheet before the game commences and signed by both team managers. If no agreement can be reached the Youth Competition Secretary must be notified immediately. The Youth Competition Secretary may make a ruling or reschedule the game within 4 weeks of the original date. Failure to accept the Secretary's decision will result in points deduction for the offending club.

ADDITIONAL RULES:

Results: all sides must advise the competitions secretary by 5.00pm of the match date, result by text or email

Sanction: no points awarded.

Both sides must return their league card within 6 days of the match.

Sanction: no points awarded.

Discipline: In the event of a player being sent off the committee must be informed within 48 hours of the offence, the CRFU discipline secretary will be informed and have final say after the club has held its own internal hearing.

Sanction: for not informing the committee of the sending off 5 points deduction. For playing a player after he has been sent off and before the discipline process has been concluded 10 points deduction.

Registration cards: a player registered with a club on the 1st of September of every season can play for that club at any time, player registration closes on the 1st of March and any player wishing to play for a Cornish club after that time can only do so if

- They are unregistered with any other club
- Moving into the area and joining their new club
- The team they were playing for is no longer running a colts team.
- The completion secretary has been informed and makes a dispensation for a player.

Registration cards must be carried for all players for all league and cup games.

League: on request by another team the cards must be shown, if a card cannot be shown for a player then that player must not be allowed to play, if none of the cards can be shown then the offending team will forfeit the game. If a player is played and is not registered or is overage then a 10 points will be deducted.

Cup games: All cards should be checked beforehand by the opposing team or the referee, during a final the cards will be checked by a committee member. If a card cannot be shown for a player then that player must not be allowed to play, if none of the cards can be shown then the offending team will forfeit the game.

Front Row: In the event of a side not having suitably qualified props before a game a front row player may be borrowed from another team with no sanctions.

In the event a prop cannot be borrowed then the game will continue with uncontested scrums.

Sanction: the offending team are deducted 1 point for a league game or start with a 7 point penalty in a cup game.

Postponed games:

A game may be postponed if a National cup game is played on the same weekend

Outcome: rearranged for the following Wednesday or 2pts each.

A game may be postponed if the referee determines before the game that the pitch is unplayable

Outcome: rearrangement on a catch up week or 2 pts. Each.

If a pitch is unplayable the home team must give the away team a "heads up" on the Friday evening with a pitch inspection taking place by 9.00am on the Saturday morning, if the away team have a playable pitch then the home team are obliged to travel.

Outcome: no pitch available, rearrangement on a catch up weekend or 2 pts. Each.

If the home team fails to travel, no points awarded to the non-traveling side, the other side awarded 5pts.

No reasons other than the above will be accepted for a postponement, games can be played with a min of 12 players per side.

Appeal process:

A decision made by the league secretary may be appealed against. Notification of your wish to appeal must be made within 48 hours of the original decision and sent to the group secretary for the committee to decide upon, a meeting may be called at the discretion of the group secretary / Chairman.

A further appeal is permitted, your complaint must be put in writing within 7 days of the committee's decision. Your complaint will then be passed to an independent panel (to be decided) for a final decision.

Any points not covered above must be verified by the Youth Competition Secretary or Youth Competition Committee.

The Youth Competition Committee consists of the Chairman, the Secretary and the Competition Secretary
CLUBS PLEASE NOTE:

All CRFU Youth group trophies, including the sevens competition, must be returned engraved to the Competitions Secretary two weeks in advance of finals or your club will be invoiced for a replacement cup.

Note. Amendment

In accordance with the RFU age grade ruling, any club may select in their squad a player from the U16s, U17s, U18s and U19s age groups (subject to the correct playing up or down assessment).

The opposition must be notified of any U16s or U19s in the match day squad 24 hours prior to kick off, no U16s is allowed on the field of play if an U19 is playing, the half game rule still applies. – penalty -5 league points.

THE CORNWALL RUGBY FOOTBALL UNION
TRIBUTE SUPER CUP COMPETITION
COMPETITION RULES

1. The Competition shall be called "The Cornwall Rugby Football Union Tribute Super Cup Competition" ("the Competition"). The Competition shall be organised by the CRFU Competitions Standing Committee ("the Competitions Standing Committee").
2. All matches in the Competition shall be played under the Laws of Rugby Football and comply with the Bye-Laws, Rules and Regulations of the Rugby Football Union ("the RFU") and the Cornwall Rugby Football Union ("the CRFU") in particular the English Clubs Rugby Union Championship National Clubs Association Regulations for National Divisions 1 and 2 (North and South) ("the Championship Regulations"). Where the rules of the Competition conflict with the Championship Regulations, the rules of the Competition shall prevail.
3. *The Competition shall be open to clubs who are affiliated to the CRFU competing at Level 5 and above in the RFU Clubs Championship.*
4. **Eligibility of Players**
No player may represent a club in the Competition either as a player or selected replacement unless he holds effective registration with that club. A club shall be permitted to select not more than seven replacement players. Including replacements, a club must have at least five players capable of playing in the front row. A club with any doubt or question concerning player eligibility shall apply to either the Chairman or Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee for a decision which shall be binding on that club.

The RFU Regulation permitting rolling substitutions shall apply to this Competition.

Prior to commencement of the Competition each season the Secretary of each participating club shall supply the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee with an up to date list of the eligible players registered with that club with the RFU

5. In the event of a dispute, a Disputes Committee consisting of the Chairman, Secretary and two other members of the Competitions Standing Committee shall decide on the matter, subject only to a right of appeal to the Management Board of the CRFU ("the Management Board") whose decision shall be final and binding. Any such appeal to the Competitions Standing Committee must be accompanied by the payment of a fee of £25.00 and any such appeal to the Management Board must be accompanied by the payment of a fee of £50.00 which is refundable in the event the appeal is upheld unless the Competitions Standing Committee or (as appropriate) the Management Board decide otherwise. Any cheque, bankers draft, postal or money order in payment of an appeal fee shall be made payable to the "Cornwall RFU Limited".
6. Any breach of the rules of the Competition may disqualify the offending club from taking any further part in the Competition for that season and may result in that club being deprived of any financial benefit from it. The Competitions Standing Committee shall have the power to reinstate a club in the Competition where it has been eliminated by such offending club.
7. For matches in the Competition (other than the final) Club Secretaries shall immediately notify the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee and the Appointments Secretary of the Cornwall Rugby Referees Society ("the Referees Society") of the agreed date upon which the match is to be played. If mutually agreeable, a normal fixture between the Clubs may count as a Competition match, provided that prior written notice has been given to the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee and the Appointments

Secretary of the Referees Society. Any difficulty in arranging a match in accordance with these regulations shall be referred to the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee.

8. Grounds and Match Management

8.1 The home club shall be responsible for correctly and clearly marking its pitch. In addition, it must make proper provision to ensure that (with the exception of the touch judges, the fourth official (if appointed) and others permitted by the rules of the Competition) all spectators replacements and officials are kept at a reasonable distance from the field of play by a permanent or semi permanent barrier.

8.2 The home club shall in addition make provision for two "technical areas" one for each team competing in the match (each of which areas shall not exceed 10 square metres and which shall be at least one metre from the touchline of the pitch). The "technical areas" when occupied must not in any way impede the touch judges or fourth official (if appointed) undertaking their responsibilities). The "technical areas" must be clearly designated between the touchline of the pitch and any perimeter or pitchside fencing or other barrier as being that to which all those permitted within the pitchside or perimeter fencing (i.e. not more than two medical staff responsible for administering treatment to players and not more than two persons carrying water for the players) are to be restricted during the match other than periods of half time or (if appropriate) between full time and any replay and any half time interval during such replay.

8.3 Participating clubs in a match must ensure that team replacements and coaching staff are not permitted within the pitchside or perimeter fencing or other barrier (unless there is a permanent or semi permanent "dugout" in place in which case team replacements and coaching staff must confine themselves to the "dugout" or keep without the pitchside or perimeter fencing or other barrier) other than when a replacement is about to replace a player on the pitch, when a player is temporarily suspended or at and for the extent of half time or (if appropriate) the period between full time and any replay and any half time interval during such replay.

8.4 Not more than four water carriers per team (including medical staff) are permitted within the pitchside or perimeter fencing or other barrier and water carriers may only be permitted onto the playing area for the purpose of taking water to the players at such times as shall be approved by the Referee (on any other occasion players must come to the touchline to get water).

9. Postponed Matches

If weather or ground conditions prevent a match being played or a match is abandoned because of such conditions, with less than sixty minutes having been played, it shall, if possible, be played or replayed. If this is not possible, the matter shall be referred to the Competitions Standing Committee for a decision. If a match is abandoned because of such conditions, when sixty or more minutes have been played, the score at the moment of abandonment shall stand and be deemed to be the final score in the match. The Referee's decision as to the necessity for abandonment and the number of minutes played at the moment of abandonment shall be final.

10. Notification of Results

The Secretary of the home club shall be responsible for informing the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee of the result of the match within TWENTY FOUR HOURS of the final whistle and in writing not later than first post three days after the match is played. Failure to telephone in the match result and/or send in the completed official match result card within the time limits laid down will incur a fine for each offence of £25.00. Any Club

wishing to appeal must follow the appeals procedure laid down in Paragraph 5 of the Competition rules.

11. Award of Match Points

11.1 In the group stage of the Competition four points shall be awarded to the winning team for each match and two points awarded to each side in the event of any match being drawn. In addition one bonus point shall be awarded to any team scoring four or more tries in a match and a further one bonus point shall be awarded to any losing team where the margin of defeat is seven points or less.

11.2 At the end of the group stage the two teams with the highest aggregate number of points awarded shall go forward to contest the final of the Competition. If this does not produce the finalists, the teams with the greatest points difference between those scored and those conceded in the group stage of the Competition shall go forward to the final. If it is still not possible to separate teams the team with the highest combined total of points scored in the group stage of the Competition shall go forward to the final.

11.3.1 In the final, if it is played as a single match, if after forty minutes of play each way, the scores are still level, there shall be an immediate period of replay between the same teams, of ten minutes each way, with a one minute interval. If the scores are then equal, the team that has scored the most tries shall be the winner. If this does not produce a result, the team that has scored the most goals from tries shall be the winner. If no result is then achieved, the trophy shall be shared between the finalists. There shall be no replay.

11.3.2 In the final, if it is played over two legs, the aggregate scores of the two matches shall decide which team shall be the winner. The first leg match shall be limited to forty minutes of play each way. If, at the end of the two forty minutes of play in the second leg match, the aggregate scores of the two matches are still level, there shall be an immediate period of replay between the same teams, of ten minutes each way, with a one minute interval. If the scores are still equal the team that has scored most tries in both matches shall be declared the winner. If this does not produce a result, the team that has scored the most goals from tries in both matches shall be declared the winner. If the aggregate scores still be equal and the aggregate goals from tries still be equal, the trophy shall be shared between the finalists. There shall be no replay.

Unless otherwise arranged by the Competitions Standing Committee the final shall be played on a neutral ground and the winning finalist shall receive the Cornwall Rugby Football Union Super Cup Trophy. Prior to 1 March in the following season the Hon. Secretary of the winning finalist shall be responsible for returning the trophy to either the Chairman or Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee suitably engraved with the name of the winning club, cleaned and in good condition. Any club returning the trophy late, un-engraved, unclean or damaged shall be liable to a fine of £25.00 or shall bear the actual cost of engraving, cleaning or repair whichever shall be the greater. The winning finalist shall be responsible for the security of the trophy whilst it is in its possession.

12. Matches shall start at the agreed time; any delay may be reported by the non-offending club to the Competitions Standing Committee and may lead to the imposition of sanctions against the offending club.

13. Referees and Assistant Referees

Referees for all matches in the Competition and Touch Judges for the final shall be appointed by the Referees Society. The home team in each match in the group stage shall be responsible for appointing a Fourth Official who will act under the authority of the Referee and who shall fulfil such duties as shall be prescribed by the RFU.

14. Replacements

Subject to Paragraph 4 of the Competition rules, replacements are permitted according to Regulations of the RFU.

15. Clash of Colours

In the event of clubs having similar or clashing colours the home team shall be responsible for changing its colours. For the final, the home team shall be decided by the toss of a coin by the Chairman or other nominated member of the Competitions Standing Committee.

16. Finance

- 16.1 The home club shall be responsible for the proper promotion of the match. The match shall be **ALL PAY** except for children under the age of sixteen years. The gross gate and programme receipts, **less programme and referees expenses**, (the gross gate meaning the charge or charges made for entry to the field and, if appropriate, stand or stands, and excluding any charges for car parking, which must be detailed separately) for all matches except the final, shall be shared between the two competing clubs and the home club shall, where possible, pass the appropriate share to the away club on the same day of the game, but in any event not more than seven days after the match. The proceeds of the game shall be counted at the end of the game by **one person** from each club. The home club shall bear the match expenses and the visiting club shall pay its own travelling expenses.

- 16.2 At the conclusion of the Competition the receipts from the final and the sponsorship income shall be apportioned by the Hon Treasurer of the CRFU. The total income shall be divided equally between all participating clubs in the Competition, the Cornwall Knockout Cup Competition and the Cornwall Clubs Cup Competition that qualify under Paragraph 16.3.

16.3 Any club that does not fulfill a fixture in the Competition may not receive a share of that season's Competition income.

17. Terms and Conditions of Participation

- 17.1 Each club by agreeing to enter the Competition and/or by commencing its first match in the Competition agrees it has entered into a legally binding obligation with the CRFU and as separate obligations with each other club in the Competition and with any sponsor of the Competition that it will:-

- 17.1.1 fulfil its fixtures in the Competition and comply in every respect with the rules of the Competition
- 17.1.2 play in each game in the Competition for which it qualifies
- 17.1.3 at all times comply with each and every obligation and requirement entered into by the CRFU with third parties, including but not limited to any sponsor of the Competition under the terms and conditions of any sponsorship agreement provided that details of any such obligations and requirements have been notified by the CRFU in writing to the participating clubs by 31 July each year
- 17.1.4 permit access to its premises during before or after the match to any person authorised by the Competitions Standing Committee (with or without prior notice) to check compliance with all and/or any of the rules of the Competition and to provide to any such person such documentation and information as might reasonably be required to identify any player in any match in the Competition and produce evidence of such player's effective registration with the club

- 17.2 Each club by commencing its first match in the Competition agrees it has entered into a legally binding obligation with the CRFU and as a separate covenant with each other club in the Competition, Referee, Touch Judge or Match Official involved in any match in the Competition or cancellation or abandonment thereof that it will not hold liable or make any claim against such official, the Competitions Standing Committee, the Management Board or the CRFU:-
- 17.2.1 for any loss cost charge compensation or expense arising out of or in connection with any kind of death occurring to or injury or illness suffered by any player, spectator or other person (insofar as is permitted in law)
- 17.2.2 for any damage to property of any kind
- 17.2.3 for any other loss cost charge expense or damages be it for loss of profit expense incurred or otherwise and whether directly or consequential or in relation to the result of any match arising out of or due to any decision or action that such official may take under the Laws of Rugby Football, the rules of the Competition or any other rules or regulations published by the RFU or the CRFU or which have been properly introduced by the RFU or in respect of the normal procedures to hold, play, control, cancel or abandon a match.
- 17.3 Any club selected to play in the Competition agrees that:-
- 17.3.1 if it fails to honour a fixture or withdraws having previously agreed to take part therein or
- 17.3.2 if in the opinion of the Competitions Standing Committee (subject to the club's right of appeal set out in Paragraph 5 of the rules of the Competition) it may not be permitted to take part in a future RFU cup competition it may not be eligible to participate in any cup competition organised by the RFU in the following season.
- 17.4 Each club by entering the Competition agrees with each other club in the Competition and the CRFU that the Competitions Standing Committee has the absolute and unfettered discretion to decide on matters not provided for in and in the interpretation of the rules of the Competition and/or make any further or alternative rules or regulations for the Competition where there is a requirement therefore. The decision of the Competitions Standing Committee is final and binding save for any club's right to appeal to the Management Board utilising the procedure set out in Paragraph 5 of the rules of the Competition) provided such appeal is lodged with the appropriate appeal fee within 48 hours of any action taken by the Competitions Standing Committee under this Paragraph 17.4 being made public or the club having been advised thereof (whichever shall be the later).

NOTES

1. Normal gate charges in the Competition should be a minimum of Five Pounds (£5.00) per person with children under sixteen years free. Where applicable, additional charges for entry to the stand or stands shall apply.
2. All results in the Competition must be reported to the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee on the official match result cards supplied not later than first post three days after a match is played.

THE CORNWALL RUGBY FOOTBALL UNION TRIBUTE KNOCKOUT CUP COMPETITION COMPETITION RULES

1. The Competition shall be called "The Cornwall Rugby Football Union Tribute Knockout Cup Competition" ("the Competition"). The Competition shall be organised by the CRFU Competitions Standing Committee ("the Competitions Standing Committee").
2. All matches in the Competition shall be played under the Laws of Rugby Football and comply with the Bye-Laws, Rules and Regulations of the Rugby Football Union ("the RFU") and the Cornwall Rugby Football Union ("the CRFU") in particular the Intermediate Clubs Knockout Competition Regulations ("the Intermediate Cup Regulations"). Where the rules of the Competition conflict with the Intermediate Cup Regulations, the rules of the Competition shall prevail.
3. *The Competition shall be open to clubs who are affiliated to the CRFU, competing at Levels 6 to 8 in the RFU Clubs Championship.*

4. Eligibility of Players

No player may represent a club in the Competition either as a player or selected replacement unless he holds effective registration with that club. A player may not represent a club in the Competition either as a player or selected replacement if, in the same season, he has played or been selected as a replacement for another club in any round of the Competition, the Cornwall Rugby Football Union Tribute Super Cup Competition ("the Cornwall Super Cup Competition") or any National Cup competition or if he is under Contract to or any other arrangement requiring him to play for another club. In the first and second rounds of the Competition a club shall be permitted to select not more than four replacement players whilst in the semi-final and final of the Competition, not more than six replacement players shall be permitted. In the first and second rounds of the Competition, including replacements, a club must have at least four players capable of playing in the front row, whilst in the semi-final and final of the Competition, including replacements, a club must have at least five players capable of playing in the front row. A club with any doubt or question concerning player eligibility shall apply to either the Chairman or Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee for a decision which shall be binding on that club.

The RFU Regulation permitting rolling substitutions shall apply to this Competition.

Prior to commencement of the Competition each season the Secretary of each participating club shall supply the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee with an up to date list of the eligible players registered with that club with the RFU

5. In the event of a dispute, a Disputes Committee consisting of the Chairman, Secretary and two other members of the Competitions Standing Committee shall decide on the matter, subject only to a right of appeal to the Management Board of the CRFU ("the Management Board") whose decision shall be final and binding. Any such appeal to the Competitions Standing Committee must be accompanied by the payment of a fee of £25.00 and any such appeal to the Management Board must be accompanied by the payment of a fee of £50.00 which is refundable in the event the appeal is upheld unless the Competitions Standing Committee or (as appropriate) the Management Board decide otherwise. Any cheque, bankers draft, postal or money order in payment of an appeal fee shall be made payable to the "Cornwall RFU Limited".

6. Any breach of the rules of the Competition shall disqualify the offending club from taking any further part in the Competition for that season and may result in that club being deprived of any financial benefit from it and the Competitions Standing Committee shall have the power to reinstate a club in the Competition where it has been eliminated by such offending club. This power shall cease to apply at 2.00 pm two days before the date when a further round of the Competition, immediately following that when the breach of the rules was committed, is scheduled to be played.
7. The draw for the Competition shall be made by the Competitions Standing Committee. To allow for extra time, kick off times shall, unless mutually agreed, be 30 minutes earlier than the recommended kick off time in the CRFU Byelaws. The first named club to be drawn in any round shall be considered to be the home team and unless mutually agreed the venue for the match shall be the ground of such home club. Rounds shall be played no later than the fixed dates or fixed weekends laid down by the Competitions Standing Committee. **If a weekend is fixed and the two clubs cannot agree on which day to play, the match will be played on the Saturday.** In the event of a disagreement, Paragraph 5 of the Competition rules shall apply. **For all rounds (other than set dates) Club Secretaries shall immediately notify the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee and the Appointments Secretary of the Cornwall Rugby Referees Society ("the Referees Society") of the agreed date upon which the match is to be played.** If mutually agreeable, a normal fixture between the Clubs may count as the Competition match, provided that prior written notice has been given to the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee and the Appointments Secretary of the Referees Society. Any difficulty in arranging a match in accordance with these regulations shall be referred to the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee.

If this is not possible, the matter shall be referred to the Competitions Standing Committee for a decision. If a match is abandoned because of such conditions, when sixty or more minutes have been played, the score at the moment of abandonment shall stand and be deemed to be the final score in the match. The Referee's decision as to the necessity for abandonment and the number of minutes played at the moment of abandonment shall be final.

10. Notification of Results

The Secretary of the home club shall be responsible for informing the Denis Preece of the Competitions Standing Committee of the result of the match within TWENTY FOUR HOURS of the final whistle and in writing not later than first post three days after the match is played. Failure to telephone in the match result and/or send in the completed official match result card within the time limits laid down will incur a fine for each offence of £25.00. Any Club wishing to appeal must follow the procedure laid down in Paragraph 5 of the Competition rules.

11. Drawn Matches

- 11.1 In all rounds except the final, if after forty minutes of play each way, the scores are still level, there shall be an immediate period of replay between the same teams, of ten minutes each way with a one minute interval. If the scores are then equal the team that has scored the most tries shall go forward to the next round. If this does not produce a result the team that has scored the most goals from tries shall go forward to the next round. If the scores still be equal and the goals from tries still be equal, the visiting team shall go forward to the next round.
- 11.2 In the final, if after forty minutes of play each way, the scores are still level, there shall be an immediate period of replay between the same teams, of ten minutes each way with a one-minute interval. If the scores are then equal, the team that has scored the most tries shall be the winner. If this does not produce a result, the team that has scored the most goals from tries shall be the winner. If no result is then achieved, the trophy shall be shared between the finalists. There shall be no replay.

Unless otherwise arranged by the Competitions Standing Committee the final shall be played on a neutral ground and the winning finalist shall receive the BBC Spotlight Trophy. Prior to 1 March in the following season the Hon. Secretary of the winning finalist shall be responsible for returning the trophy to either the Chairman or Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee suitably engraved with the name of the winning club, cleaned and in good condition. Any club returning the trophy late, un-engraved, unclean or damaged shall be liable to a fine of £25.00 or shall bear the actual cost of engraving, cleaning or repair whichever shall be greater. The winning finalist shall be responsible for the security of the trophy whilst it is in its possession.

12. Matches shall start at the agreed time; any delay may be reported by the non-offending club to the Competitions Standing Committee and may lead to the disqualification of the offending club from that season's Competition

13. Referees and Assistant Referees

Referees for all matches in the Competition and Touch Judges for the semi finals and final shall be appointed by the Referees Society.

14. Replacements

Subject to Paragraph 4 of the Competition rules, replacements are permitted according to Regulations of the RFU.

15. Clash of Colours

In the event of clubs having similar or clashing colours the home team shall be responsible for changing its colours. For the final, the home team shall be decided by the toss of a coin by the Chairman or other nominated member of the Competitions Standing Committee.

16. Finance

- 16.1 The home club shall be responsible for the proper promotion of the match. The match shall be **ALL PAY** except for children under the age of sixteen years. The gross gate and programme receipts, **less programme and referees expenses**, (the gross gate meaning the charge or charges made for entry to the field and, if appropriate, stand or stands, and excluding any charges for car parking, which must be detailed separately) for all matches except the final, shall be shared between the two competing clubs and the home club shall, where possible, pass the appropriate share to the away club on the same day of the game, but in any event not more than seven days after the match. The proceeds of the game shall be counted at the end of the game by **one person** from each club. The home club shall bear the match expenses and the visiting club shall pay its own travelling expenses.

- 16.2 At the conclusion of the Competition the receipts from the final and the sponsorship income shall be apportioned by the Hon Treasurer of the CRFU. The total income shall be divided equally between all participating clubs in the Competition, the Cornwall Super Cup Competition and the Cornwall Clubs Cup Competition that qualify under Paragraph 16.3.

16.3 Any club that does not fulfil a fixture in the Competition may not receive a share of that season's Competition income.

17. Terms and Conditions of Participation

- 17.1 Each club by agreeing to enter the Competition and/or by commencing its first match in the Competition agrees it has entered into a legally binding obligation with the CRFU and as separate obligations with each other club in the Competition and with any sponsor of the Competition that it will:-

- 17.1.1 fulfil its fixtures in the Competition and comply in every respect with the rules of the Competition
- 17.1.2 play in each game in the Competition for which it qualifies
- 17.1.3 at all times comply with each and every obligation and requirement entered into by the CRFU with third parties, including but not limited to any sponsor of the Competition under the terms and conditions of any sponsorship agreement provided that details of any such obligations and requirements have been notified by the CRFU in writing to the participating clubs by 31 July each year
- 17.1.4 permit access to its premises during before or after the match to any person authorised by the Competitions Standing Committee (with or without prior notice) to check compliance with all and/or any of the rules of the Competition and to provide to

any such person such documentation and information as might reasonably be required to identify any player in any match in the Competition and produce evidence of such player's effective registration with the club

- 17.2 Each club by commencing its first match in the Competition agrees it has entered into a legally binding obligation with the CRFU and as a separate covenant with each other club in the Competition, Referee, Touch Judge or Match Official involved in any match in the Competition or cancellation or abandonment thereof that it will not hold liable or make any claim against such official, the Competitions Standing Committee, the Management Board or the CRFU:-
- 17.2.1 for any loss cost charge compensation or expense arising out of or in connection with any kind of death occurring to or injury or illness suffered by any player, spectator or other person (insofar as is permitted in law)
- 17.2.2 for any damage to property of any kind
- 17.2.3 for any other loss cost charge expense or damages be it for loss of profit expense incurred or otherwise and whether directly or consequential or in relation to the result of any match arising out of or due to any decision or action that such official may take under the Laws of Rugby Football, the rules of the Competition or any other rules or regulations published by the RFU or the CRFU or which have been properly introduced by the RFU or in respect of the normal procedures to hold, play, control, cancel or abandon a match.
- 17.3 Any club selected to play in the Competition agrees that:-
- 17.3.1 if it fails to honour a fixture or withdraws having previously agreed to take part therein or
- 17.3.2 if in the opinion of the Competitions Standing Committee (subject to the club's right of appeal set out in Paragraph 5 of the rules of the Competition) it should not be permitted to take part in a future RFU cup competition it shall not be eligible to participate in any cup competition organised by the RFU in the following season
- 17.4 Each club by entering the Competition agrees with each other club in the Competition and the CRFU that the Competitions Standing Committee has the absolute and unfettered discretion to decide on matters not provided for in and in the interpretation of the rules of the Competition and/or make any further or alternative rules or regulations for the Competition where there is a requirement thereof. The decision of the Competitions Standing Committee is final and binding save for any club's right to appeal to the Management Board utilising the procedure set out in Paragraph 5 of the rules of the Competition) provided such appeal is lodged with the appropriate appeal fee within 48 hours of any action taken by the Competitions Standing Committee under this Paragraph 17.4 being made public or the club having been advised thereof (whichever shall be the later).

NOTES

1. Normal gate charges in the Competition should be a minimum of Four Pounds (£4.00) per person with children under sixteen years free. Where applicable, additional charges for entry to the stand or stands shall apply.
2. All results in the Competition must be reported to the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee on the official match result cards supplied not later than first post three days after a match is played.

**THE CORNWALL RUGBY FOOTBALL UNION
TRIBUTE CORNWALL CLUBS CUP COMPETITION
COMPETITION RULES**

1. The Competition shall be called "The Cornwall Rugby Football Union Tribute Cornwall Clubs Cup Competition" ("the Competition"). The Competition shall be organised by the CRFU Competitions Committee ("the Competitions Committee").
2. All matches in the Competition shall be played under the Laws of Rugby Football and comply with the Bye-Laws, Rules and Regulations of the Rugby Football Union ("the RFU") and the Cornwall Rugby Football Union ("the CRFU") in particular the Junior Vase Knockout Competition Regulations ("the Junior Vase Regulations"). Where the rules of the Competition conflict with the Junior Vase Regulations, the rules of the Competition shall prevail.
3. The Competition shall be open to clubs who are affiliated to the CRFU, and who play in the Cornwall Leagues of the RFU Clubs Championship and to those who do not play in league rugby.

4. Eligibility of Players

No player may represent a club in the Competition either as a player or selected replacement unless he holds effective registration with that club. A player may not represent a club in the Competition either as a player or selected replacement if, in the same season, he has played or been selected as a replacement for another club in any round of the Competition, the Cornwall Rugby Football Union Tribute Super Cup Competition ("the Cornwall Super Cup Competition"), the Cornwall Rugby Football Union Tribute Knockout Cup Competition ("the Cornwall Knockout Cup Competition") or the National Cup competitions or if he is under Contract to or any other arrangement requiring him to play for another club. In the group and all other rounds including the semi final and final of the competition a club shall be permitted to select not more than six replacements players. In the group and all other rounds including the semi final and final of the competition including replacements a club must have at least five players capable of playing in the front row. A club with any doubt or question concerning player eligibility shall apply to either the Chairman or Secretary of the Competitions Committee for a decision which shall be binding on that club.

The RFU Regulation permitting rolling substitutions shall apply to this Competition.

Prior to commencement of the Competition each season the Secretary of each participating club shall supply the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee with an up to date list of the eligible players registered with that club with the RFU.

Note – Restriction on number of foreign players permitted now deleted.

5. In the event of a dispute, a Disputes Committee consisting of the Chairman, Secretary and two other members of the Competitions Committee shall decide on the matter, subject only to a right of appeal to the Management Board of the CRFU ("the Management Board") whose decision shall be final and binding. Any such appeal to the Competitions Committee must be accompanied by the payment of a fee of £10.00 and any such appeal to the Management Board must be accompanied by the payment of a fee of £25.00 which is refundable in the event the appeal is upheld unless the Competitions Committee or (as appropriate) the Management Board decide otherwise. Any cheque, bankers draft, postal or

money order in payment of an appeal fee shall be made payable to the "Cornwall RFU Limited".

6. Any breach of the rules of the Competition shall disqualify the offending club from taking any further part in the Competition for that season and may result in it being deprived of any financial benefit from it and the Competitions Committee shall have the power to reinstate a club in the Competition where it has been eliminated by such offending club. This power shall cease to apply at 2.00 pm two days before the date when a further group match or round of the Competition, immediately following that when the breach of the rules was committed, is scheduled to be played.
7. The draw for the Competition shall be made by the Competitions Committee. To allow for extra time, kick off times shall, unless mutually agreed, be 30 minutes earlier than the recommended kick off time in the CRFU Bye-laws. The first named club to be drawn in any round shall be considered to be the home team and unless mutually agreed the venue for the match shall be the ground of such home club. Group matches or rounds shall be played no later than the fixed dates or fixed weekends laid down by the Competitions Committee. **If a weekend is fixed and the two clubs cannot agree on which day to play, the match will be played on the Saturday.** In the event of a disagreement, Paragraph 5 of the Competition rules shall apply. **For all group matches or rounds (other than set dates) Club Secretaries shall immediately notify the Secretary of the Competitions Committee and the Appointments Secretary of the Cornwall Rugby Referees Society ("the Referees Society") of the agreed date upon which the match is to be played.** If mutually agreeable, a normal fixture between the Clubs may count as the Competition match, provided that prior written notice has been given to the Secretary of the Competitions Committee and the Appointments Secretary of the Referees Society. Any difficulty in arranging a match in accordance with these regulations shall be referred to the Secretary of the Competitions Standing Committee.
8. **Grounds and Match Management**
- 8.1 The home club shall be responsible for correctly and clearly marking its pitch. In addition, it must make proper provision to ensure that (with the exception of the assistant referees the fourth official (if appointed) and others permitted by the rules of the Competition) all spectators replacements and officials are kept at a reasonable distance from the field of play by a permanent or semi permanent barrier.
- 8.2 The home club shall in addition make provision for two "technical areas" one for each team competing in the match (each of which areas shall not exceed 10 square metres and which shall be at least one metre from the touchline of the pitch. The "technical areas" when occupied must not in any way impede the touch judges or fourth official (if appointed) undertaking their responsibilities). The "technical areas" must be clearly designated between the touchline of the pitch and any perimeter or pitchside fencing or other barrier as being that to which all those permitted within the pitchside or perimeter fencing (i.e not more than two medical staff responsible for administering treatment to players, not more than two persons carrying water for the players) are to be restricted during the match other than the periods of half time or (if appropriate) between full time and any replay and any half time interval during such replay.
- 8.3 Participating clubs in a match must ensure that team replacements and coaching staff are not permitted within the pitchside or perimeter fencing or other barrier (unless there is a permanent or semi permanent "dugout" in place in which case team replacements and coaching staff must confine themselves to the "dugout" or keep without the pitchside or

perimeter fencing or other barrier) other than when a replacement is about to replace a player on the pitch, when a player is temporarily suspended or at and for the extent of half time or (if appropriate) the period between full time and any replay and any half time interval during such replay.

- 8.4 Not more than four water carriers per team (including medical staff) are permitted within the pitchside or perimeter fencing or other barrier and water carriers may only be permitted onto the playing area for the purposes of taking water to the players at such times as shall be approved by the Referee (on any other occasion players must come to the touchline to get water).

9. **Postponed Matches**

If weather or ground conditions prevent a match being played or a match is abandoned because of such conditions, with less than sixty minutes having been played, it shall, if possible, be played or replayed within seven days of the date originally fixed. If this is not possible, the matter shall be referred to the Competitions Standing Committee for a decision. If a match is abandoned because of such conditions, when sixty or more minutes have been played, the score at the moment of abandonment shall stand and be deemed to be the final score in the match. The Referee's decision as to the necessity for abandonment and the number of minutes played at the moment of abandonment shall be final.

10. **Notification of Results**

The Secretary of the home club shall be responsible for informing the Denis Preece of the Competitions Committee of the result of the match within TWENTY FOUR HOURS of the final whistle and in writing not later than first post three days after the match is played. Failure to telephone in the match result and/or send in the completed official match result card within the time limits laid down will incur a fine for each offence of £25.00. Any Club wishing to appeal must follow the appeals procedure laid down in Paragraph 5 of the Competition rules.

11. **Drawn Matches**

- 11.1 In all group matches or rounds except the final, if after forty minutes of play each way, the scores are still level, there shall be an immediate period of replay between the same teams, of ten minutes each way with a one minute interval. If the scores are then equal the team that has scored the most tries shall be the winner and if appropriate go forward to the next round. If this does not produce a result the team that has scored the most goals from tries shall be the winner and if appropriate go forward to the next round. If the scores still be equal and the goals from tries still be equal, the visiting team shall be the winner and if appropriate go forward to the next round.

- 11.2 Rule deleted. Semi-final round now played as a single leg match.

If no result is then achieved, the trophy shall be shared between the finalists. There shall be no replay.

REVISED FOR SEASON 2022 / 2023**

The regulations relating to the playing of league rugby in the new Counties 2&3 Tribute Cornwall Leagues will be modified in so far as matches played at Level 8 & 9 (County's 2&3) (together "the modified leagues") are concerned. The modified leagues are subject to all ECC Regulations in so far as these are not varied by or inconsistent with these Regulations.

The modifications to Counties 2 Tribute Cornwall (level (8).

1. All players in the Counties 2 Tribute Cornwall league must be registered with their club in accordance with the Player Registration Regulations .
 2. Electronic match result cards must be completed in accordance with the SWDOC Administrative Instructions.
 3. Clubs at level 8 may select up to FOUR (4) Replacements, with up to Eight (8) Interchanges.
 4. If a scheduled Counties 2 Tribute Cornwall match is cancelled because of weather or a lack of referee it will be rescheduled for the first available Saturday by the SW Admin office who will inform both club's NLC of the rescheduled match date. If the rescheduled date clashes with a CB cup date the league match will take precedence.
 5. If a scheduled Counties 2 Tribute Cornwall match is cancelled for any reason other than weather or lack of Referee, the non-offending club will be awarded five league points. The league secretary will decide if points will be deducted from the offending club.
 6. If any club fails to complete 25% of their scheduled Counties 2 Tribute Cornwall matches the clubs total league points will be expunged from the English Clubs league tables.
 7. Clubs must inform the SW admin office and their league secretary by 3.30pm on the day of a match if a match in the Counties 2 Tribute Cornwall is cancelled for any reason., The SW Admin must also be informed of the match result by 5.30pm on the day of the match or within one hour of a match played at any other time by phone or text. SW Admin tele number 01822 678272 Match Result tele number 01822 678007 Text result number 07797800102.
- Otherwise, all existing English club championship regulations will apply.

The modifications to Counties 3 Tribute Cornwall (level 9).

- 1 Counties 3 Tribute Cornwall clubs are advised to register their players in accordance with the player Registration Regulations. Regulation 13.4.1 (b).
2. Clubs in the Counties 3 Tribute Cornwall league may use TWO (2) unregistered players in League Matches, Unregistered players must be registered with your club before playing for The club on a second location.
3. Electronic match result cards must be completed with player's names and the match result. If a player is not registered to play league rugby for the club the card must be marked with a cross alongside the player's name and DOB.
4. Clubs at level NINE (9) may select Six (6) replacements with up to Ten (10) interchanges.
5. If a scheduled Counties 3 Tribute Cornwall match is cancelled because of weather or a lack of a Referee, the match will be rescheduled by SW Admin office for the first available Saturday, club's NLC will be informed of the rescheduled date.
6. If a scheduled Counties 3 Tribute Cornwall match is cancelled for any reason other than weather or lack of a referee, the non-offending club will be awarded Five (5) points. The League secretary will decide if points will be deducted from the offending club.
7. If any club fails to complete 25% of their scheduled Counties 3 Tribute Cornwall League Matches, the clubs total League points will be expunged from the English Clubs League Tables.

8. Clubs must inform the SW admin office by 3.30 on the day of the match if a Counties 3 Tribute Cornwall League match is cancelled for any reason. The SW admin office must also be informed of the match result by 5.30 on the day of the match, or within one hour of a match played at any other time by phone or text. 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RULES OF THE CORNWALL RFU 2nd XV COMPETITIONS

These rules apply to both league and cup competitions.

ADDITION FOR SEASON 22-23 - DISCIPLINE

With the reported rise in cases of match official abuse from spectators, and coaches we feel we need to do more to promote and enforce the values of our game.

Therefore, in addition to the normal discipline process the competitions committee reserve the right to penalise teams by way of points deduction for league games and forfeiting wins in cup matches.

It is all our responsibility to come down heavy of cases of ill discipline and lack of respect and we will punish any cases that are reported to us.

1. The competition shall be known as the Cornwall RFU knockout Cup or league Competition and shall be open to all clubs with membership with the Cornwall RFU. Clubs wishing to enter must inform the Youth Competition Secretary by the 1st of August.

2. Cornwall RFU committee shall appoint a Competition Secretary Who shall run all competitions and have the final decision on any conflicts. An appeal on the competitions secretary's decision must be put in writing to the competitions Chairman within 7 days of the decision for the committee to discuss.

3. The competitions Secretary shall decide upon the format, depending on the number of teams entered and a draw made accordingly. The Competition Secretary shall issue results of the draw, including dates of matches to participating clubs.

4. Matches will normally be played on the weekend of the dates stated in the draw. However mid-week/floodlight games are permissible provided mutually agreed to overcome any fixture problems. Should a club need to alter a scheduled date they must contact the Competition Secretary 3 weeks prior to the scheduled date. Should the reason for postponement be granted, the Competition Secretary will reschedule the game within 4 weeks of the original date. Failure to accept the Secretary's decision may result in a penalty.

5. Players must have a current registration with their respective clubs, any players loaned should be written on the match card with an Asterix next to their name.

team sheets are provided by the Competition Secretary, they will include players name and RFU registration number. A player who is not a registered member of any club participating in the competition may join, providing he does register. Any player wishing to Join another club and is not cup tied (3 games or less) may do so with the relevant paperwork completed and signed off, no registered player may transfer after the deadline date which is the 1st of March without express permission from the CRFU committee. Any players not covered by the above regarding eligibility must prior to appearing in the competition contact the Competition Secretary.

6. Should a pitch be deemed unplayable within 24 hours of the kick off, a local member of the Cornwall Referees Society must be asked to confirm this decision. The opponents and the Competition Secretary must be notified

immediately. The Competition Secretary will reschedule the game, Failure to accept the Secretary's decision will result in points or game deduction for the offending club.

7. All games shall have a duration of 40 minutes each way, In the event of an abandoned match, for whatever reason, the result must be notified to the Competition Secretary. The Competition Committee / discipline committee will make the final decision.

8. Points for pool matches will be awarded as follows:

4 points for a win

2 points for a draw

1 bonus point for a team scoring four or more tries

1 bonus point for a team losing by 7 points or more

Should a game not be played, with no fault attributed

to either side, then 2 points will be awarded to both. Where a club concedes a

game and does not play as a friendly they will be deducted 5 points and their opponents will be

awarded 5 points, should a club withdraw from the Competition, the

points together with for and against scores in matches already played

shall be removed from their opponent's total. Pool positions will be determined

firstly, by the number of pool points accrued. In the event of a tie, the pool

position will be determined by points scored and points conceded. Should there

still be a tie then the result of the game between the two teams will count.

9. Should a team be short of players, their opponents should attempt to loan their

players. Any loaned player will not be cup tied. Failure to agree this compromise

will result in the game being played with reduced numbers on both teams

(minimum of 10 players). Both teams MUST play with equal numbers always except for a yellow or red card being issued by the referee.

Substitutes: unlimited rolling substitutions with unlimited interchanges permitted.

we strongly advise that substitutes be used in a fair and even way, if a team has 15 or less players

the opposition are encouraged to use their substitutes on both sides giving every player game time and playing in the "spirit" of the game.

10. Positions in the qualifying stages (if any) of the competition shall be based firstly on the

group points awarded (as 9 above). Should there be a tie then the difference

between match points for and against shall count. If still equal then by the results

of the game between the two teams, and if still equal, then by the total number of

tries scored.

In the knockout stages of the competition, should teams be level at full time, 10 minutes extra time

each way will be played, should the score still be level then a further period of play will commence

and the first team to score, either by a kick or try will be the winner, in the event that it is not

possible to play any extra, extra time then a toss of the coin will decide the winner.

11. The finals of the competition will be played at a venue organised by the competitions

committee; the date of the finals WILL NOT be changed to accommodate clubs.

Should a game end in a draw, 10 minutes extra time each way will be played, should the score still

be level then a further period of play will commence and the first team to score, either by a kick or

try will be the winner, in the event that it is not possible to play any extra, extra time then the two

teams will share the trophy.

12. For all matches in the competition, the Cornwall Referees Society shall appoint a

referee. Should no appointed referee be available the home team as the responsibility of finding a suitably qualified/trained replacement and mutually agreeing this with the opposition, this must be noted on the team sheet before the game commences and signed by both team managers. If no agreement can be reached the Competition Secretary must be notified immediately. The Competition Secretary may make a ruling or reschedule the game within 4 weeks of the original date. Failure to accept the Secretary's decision will result in points deduction for the offending club.

ADDITIONAL RULES:

Results: all sides must advise the competitions secretary by 5.00pm of the match date, result by text or email

Sanction: no points awarded.

Both sides must return their league card within 6 days of the match.

Sanction: no points awarded.

Discipline: In the event of a player being sent off the committee must be informed within 48 hours of the offence, the CRFU discipline secretary will be informed and have final say after the club has held its own internal hearing.

Sanction: for not informing the committee of the sending off 5 points deduction. For playing a player after he has been sent off and before the discipline process has been concluded 10 points deduction.

Registration cards: a player registered with a club on the 1st of September of every season can play for that club at any time, player registration closes on the 1st of March and any player wishing to play for a Cornish club after that time can only do so if

- They are unregistered with any other club
- Moving into the area and joining their new club
- The team they were playing for is no longer running a team.
- The competition secretary has been informed and makes a dispensation for a player.

Front Row: In the event of a side not having suitably qualified props before a game a front row player may be borrowed from another team with no sanctions.

In the event a prop cannot be borrowed then the game will continue with uncontested scrums.

Sanction: the offending team are deducted 1 point for a league game or start with a 7 point penalty in a cup game.

Postponed games:

A game may be postponed if a National cup game is played on the same weekend

Outcome: rearranged for the following Wednesday or 2pts each.

A game may be postponed if the referee determines before the game that the pitch is unplayable

Outcome: rearrangement on a catch up week or 2 pts. Each.

If a pitch is unplayable the home team must give the away team a "heads up" on the Friday evening with a pitch inspection taking place by 9.00am on the Saturday morning, if the away team have a playable pitch then the home team are obliged to travel.

Outcome: no pitch available, rearrangement on a catch up weekend or 2 pts. Each.

If the home team fails to travel, no points awarded to the non-traveling side, the other side awarded 5pts.

No reasons other than the above will be accepted for a postponement, games can be played with a min of 10 players per side.

Appeal process:

A decision made by the league secretary may be appealed against. Notification of your wish to appeal must be made within 48 hours of the original decision and sent to the group secretary for the committee to decide upon, a meeting may be called at the discretion of the group secretary / Chairman.

A further appeal is permitted, your complaint must be put in writing within 7 days of the committee's decision. Your complaint will then be passed to an independent panel (to be decided) for a final decision.

Any points not covered above must be verified by the Competition Secretary or Competition Committee.

The Competition Committee consists of the Chairman, the Secretary and the Competition Secretary

SECTION 6: CRFU NOTICES

Cornwall RFU Privacy Notice.

Summary of how we and the RFU use your data

- Cornwall Rugby Football Union (CRFU) uses your personal data to manage and administer your membership and your involvement with its teams and administration affairs, and to keep in contact with you for these purposes and to inform you of CRFU events.
- Some data is shared with the RFU, who use your data to regulate, develop and manage the game.
- Data is also shared with other Constituent Bodies, Area RFU bodies, other Clubs in Cornwall, Clubs outside Cornwall and Educational establishments.
- Where we or the RFU rely on your consent, such as any consent we seek for email marketing, you can withdraw this consent at any time.
- Amongst the data we collect from you may be medical (including injury) information. We will hold this where you (or your parent) have given consent, so that we can ensure we are aware of your condition and can that you are supported appropriately.
- Where you work in a particular role within the game, you may be required to undergo a Disclosure & Barring Service check using the RFU's eDBS system. The result of this check will be input into your Game Management Service (GMS) record.

What does this policy cover?

This policy describes how Cornwall RFU (also referred to as "CRFU", "we" or "us") will make use of the data we handle in relation to our members and players, including our use of the Game Management System ("GMS") provided by the Rugby Football Union ("RFU"). The policy also describes the RFU's use of data on GMS.

It also describes your data protection rights, including a right to object to some of the processing which we carry out. More information about your rights, and how to exercise them, is set out in the "What rights do I have?" section.

What information do we collect?

We collect and process personal data from you or your parent when you join and when we carry out annual renewals of your membership. This includes:

- your name
- your gender,
- your date of birth,
- your RFU ID (as assigned in GMS)
- your home address, email address and phone number;
- your passport and NI details, where we have to check your eligibility or ability to work for us;
- your type of membership and involvement in particular teams, or any key role you may have been allocated, such as Chair, Safeguarding Lead, Membership Secretary etc.;
- your payment and/or bank account details, where you provide these to pay for membership;
- your marketing preferences, including any consents you have given us;
- your medical conditions or disability, where you provide this to us with your consent (or your parent's consent) to ensure we are aware of any support we may need to provide to you.

Some information will be generated as part of your involvement with us, in particular data about your performance, involvement in particular matches in match reports and details of any disciplinary issues or incidents you may be involved in on and off the pitch, such as within health and safety records.

What information do we receive from third parties?

Sometimes, we receive information about you from third parties. For example, if you are a child, we may be given information about you by your parents.

We may receive information relating to your existing registrations with other clubs or rugby bodies or disciplinary history from the RFU through GMS. Additionally, for certain role holders or those working with children, we may receive information from the Disclosure and Barring Service and RFU on the status of any DBS check you have been required to take.

How do we use this information, and what is the legal basis for this use?

We process this personal data for the following purposes:

- To fulfil a contract, or take steps linked to a contract: this is relevant where you make a payment for your membership and any merchandise or enter a competition. This includes:
 - taking payments;
 - communicating with you;
 - providing and arranging the delivery or other provision of products, prizes or services;
- As required by the CRFU to conduct our business and pursue our legitimate interests, in particular:
 - we will use your information to manage and administer your membership and your involvement with its teams and administration, and to keep in contact with you for these purposes;
 - we will also use data to maintain records of our performances and history, including match reports, score lines and team sheets;
 - all officials of the CRFU, all CRFU representatives of RFU and RFU Area organisations and committees and all officials and Club contacts of CRFU Clubs will be published in the CRFU Annual Handbook published each season.
- Where you give us consent:
 - we will send you direct marketing or promotional material by email;
 - we may handle medical or disability information you or your parent provides to us, to ensure we support you appropriately;
 - on other occasions where we ask you for consent, we will use the data for the purpose which we explain at that time.
- For purposes which are required by law:
 - we maintain records such as health and safety records and accounting records in order to meet specific legal requirements;
 - we ensure, where you will work with children, that you have undergone an appropriate DBS check – this is also carried out with your consent.
 - where you hold a role at the CRFU requiring us to check your right to work, we may process information to meet our statutory duties;
 - we may respond to requests by government or law enforcement authorities conducting an investigation.

How does the RFU use any of my information?

The RFU provides GMS, but make its own use of the following information:

- your name;
- your gender;
- your date of birth;
- your RFU ID (as assigned in GMS);

- your home address, email address and phone number; and
- your type of membership and involvement in particular teams at the Club, or any key role you may have been allocated, such as Chair, Safeguarding Lead, Membership Secretary etc.

The RFU uses this information as follows:

- As required by the RFU to conduct its business and pursue its legitimate interests, in particular:
 - communicating with you or about you where necessary to administer Rugby in England, including responding to any questions you send to the RFU about GMS;
 - administering and ensuring the eligibility of players, match officials and others involved in English rugby – this may involve the receipt of limited amounts of sensitive data in relation to disabled players, where they are registered for a disabled league or team, or in relation to anti-doping matters;
 - maintaining records of the game as played in England, in particular maintaining details of discipline and misconduct;
 - monitoring use of GMS, and using this to help it monitor, improve and protect its content and services and investigate any complaints received from you or from others about GMS;
 - maintaining statistics and conducting analysis on the make-up of rugby's participants;
 - ensuring compliance with the current RFU Rules and Regulations including those on the affiliation of clubs, referee societies, constituent bodies and other rugby bodies, and registration of players; and
 - communicating with you to ask for your opinion on RFU initiatives.
- For purposes which are required by law:
 - The RFU will ensure, where you will work with children and where this is required, that you have undergone an appropriate DBS check – this is also carried out with your consent.
 - The RFU may respond to requests by government or law enforcement authorities conducting an investigation.

Withdrawing consent or otherwise objecting to direct marketing

Wherever we rely on your consent, you will always be able to withdraw that consent, although we may have other legal grounds for processing your data for other purposes, such as those set out above. In some cases, we are able to send you direct marketing without your consent, where we rely on our legitimate interests. You have an absolute right to opt-out of direct marketing, or profiling we carry out for direct marketing, at any time. You can do this by following the instructions in the communication where this is an electronic message, or by contacting us using the details set out below in the **"How do I get in touch with you or the RFU?"** section.

Who will we share this data with, where and when?

In addition to sharing data with the RFU, we will share your data with: the media for public relation purposes.

Some limited information may be shared with other stakeholders in rugby, such as other clubs, Constituent Bodies, referee societies, league organisers, so that they can maintain appropriate records and assist us in organising matches and administering the game.

Personal data may be shared with government authorities and/or law enforcement officials if required for the purposes above, if mandated by law or if required for the legal protection of our or the RFU's legitimate interests in compliance with applicable laws.

Personal data will also be shared with third party service providers, who will process it on our behalf for the purposes identified above. Such third parties include the RFU as the provider of GMS.

Where information is transferred outside the EEA, and where this is to a stakeholder or vendor in a country that is not subject to an adequacy decision by the EU Commission, data is adequately protected by EU Commission approved standard contractual clauses, an appropriate Privacy Shield certification or a vendor's Processor Binding Corporate Rules. A copy of the relevant mechanism can be provided for your review on request.

What rights do I have?

You have the right to **ask us for a copy** of your personal data; to **correct, delete** or **restrict** (stop any active) processing of your personal data; and to **obtain the personal data you provide to us for a contract or with your consent in a structured, machine readable format**.

In addition, you can **object to the processing** of your personal data in some circumstances (in particular, where we don't have to process the data to meet a contractual or other legal requirement, or where we are using the data for direct marketing).

These **rights may be limited**, for example if fulfilling your request would reveal personal data about another person, or if you ask us to delete information which we are required by law to keep or have compelling legitimate interests in keeping.

You have the same rights for data held by the RFU for its own purposes on GMS.

To exercise any of these rights, you can get in touch with us – or, as appropriate, the RFU or its data protection officer – using the details set out below. If you have unresolved concerns, you have the **right to complain** to the Information Commissioner's Office.

Much of the information listed above must be provided on a mandatory basis so that we can make the appropriate legal checks and register you as required by RFU Rules and Regulations. We will inform you which information is mandatory when it is collected. Some information is optional, particularly information such as your medical information. If this is not provided, we may not be able to provide you with appropriate assistance, services or support.

How do I get in touch with you or the RFU?

How long will you retain my data?

We process the majority of your data for as long as you are an active member and for 6 years after this.

Where we process personal data for marketing purposes or with your consent, we process the data for 6 years unless you ask us to stop, when we will only process the data for a short period after this (to allow us to implement your requests). We also keep a record of the fact that you have asked us not to send you direct marketing or to process your data indefinitely so that we can respect your request in future.

Where we process personal data in connection with performing a contract or for a competition, we keep the data for 6 years

We will retain information held to maintain statutory records in line with appropriate statutory requirements or guidance.

The RFU will maintain records of individuals who have registered on GMS, records of DBS checks and the resulting outcomes and other disciplinary matters for such period as is set out in the RFU's privacy notice to be set out on www.englandrugby.com.

Records of your involvement in a particular match, on team sheets, on results pages or in match reports may be held indefinitely both by us and the RFU in order to maintain a record of the game.

THE SOUTH WESTERN DIVISION RUGBY FOOTBALL MUTUAL BENEFIT FUND

The Fund founded by the late Tom Lean of Plymouth in 1920 is administered by official representatives of Cornwall, Devon, Gloucestershire and Somerset, to provide financial assistance to players, officials and/or referees, or in the case of death where there is hardship, to relatives of same. The assistance given over the years has been considerable, but due to the development of the game on a more physical basis the number of injuries is not only increasing but is becoming more serious, and the question of insurance cover is a matter which should be looked into.

There are still a number of clubs in the South West who have apparently overlooked the important factor of making sure their players are adequately covered against injury, and the attention of every club is therefore drawn to the advantages to be obtained from taking up Membership of the South Western Mutual Benefit Fund, particularly in view of the fact that two significant changes have been made from last year, viz.,

1. The Insurance taken up with the Fund for loss of earnings Benefit will now cover up to £50 PER DAY. (All claims are based on a 6-day week.)
2. The RFU this year will pay the Compulsory Insurance and Public/Employers Liability direct. This means we have reduced our Premiums to show this.

Other points are:-

3. Maximum period of Benefit is 156 days, although this can be increased in special circumstances at the Committee's discretion.
4. In addition to **LOSS OF EARNINGS BENEFIT**, cover also includes **PHYSIOTHERAPY & DENTAL TREATMENT** not available under the D.H.S.S.
5. You will see the Fund was founded in 1920 under the aegis of the South West Constituent Bodies for rugby people.

6. Professional Players & Referees
Nbo compensation is payable in respect of loss of income derived from the playing, coaching or refereeing of rugby union football.
7. Premiums
Annual premiums are due on the 1st August in each year and cover claims in respect of injuries sustained in the ensuing 12 months.

"WARNING" – An upsurge in the number of casual games such as 'Pub XV's has been reported. Club Officials would be well advised to inform their players that they are unlikely to be covered for any form of insurance when playing in such games not on a club's normal fixture list.

IMPORTANT NOTICES

Death from Heart Failure or Collapse does not come within the cover afforded by the Rules of the Fund but is available from the RFU.

If claims are not notified in accordance with the Rules, and the correct information given, then a claim might be rejected.

**SOUTH WESTERN DIVISION RUGBY FOOTBALL
MUTUAL BENEFIT FUND
CLAIMS PROCEDURE**

1. Immediately a player is injured on the field of play his Club Secretary must be informed, and a first notification that a claim may develop must be sent to the Hon. Secretary of the Fund WITHIN TWENTY ONE DAYS.
2. WITHIN TWENTY ONE DAYS of the injury, the claim form must be completed as required, and forwarded with the relevant documents requested to the Hon. Secretary of the Fund.
3. Nett Weekly wage is the actual amount received by the player after all statutory deductions such as NHS, Tax, etc., have been deducted, and it is essential copies or proof of wages are sent.
4. As soon as the player has been declared fit to resume his occupation, a final medical certificate should be sent to the Hon. Secretary of the Fund, when the benefit due will be paid providing everything is in order.
5. It is primarily the responsibility of the player and his Captain to ensure the Official dealing with insurance is notified without undue delay of any injury to a player.

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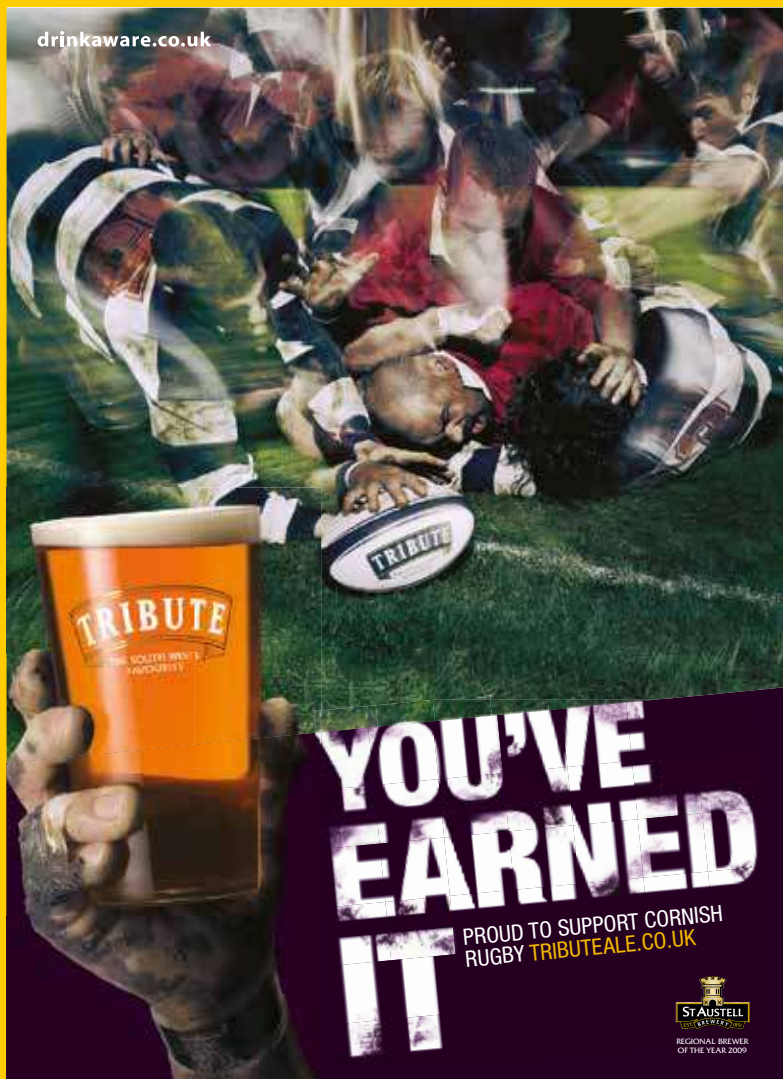
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
