Volunteer Recruitment Programme

The Volunteer Recruitment Programme is now open for applications on the RFU website it will close on Friday 24th November. The link <u>HERE</u> will take you to the relevant page.

This is the second season the programme has been run and as a reminder it provides clubs with the opportunity to apply for funding (£500) and access a range of resources, to help plan and deliver a volunteer recruitment activity. This could be a volunteer open evening, a volunteer work party, targeted marketing & communications, or another idea that meets the aim of the programme.

The objectives of the programme are to help:

- Create new opportunities to recruit volunteers
- Raise awareness of volunteer opportunities amongst new audiences
- Embed volunteer management in clubs working practices

The RFU states that "Clubs (National League 1 & below), Constituent Bodies and Referee Societies* can apply for the fund, with the opportunity for up to 130 organisations in the 23-24 season to receive a support package of £500, along with access to online learning modules and resources to plan a successful volunteer recruitment activity".

RugbySafe/Player Welfare

Reminder of the background to this important role

Recent changes regarding the roles and responsibilities within the governance of rugby have emphasised the role of RugbySafe within the structure of the community game which has stipulated the creation of the Rugby Safe representative on CRFU who, in turn, will liaise and support club Rugby Safe leads.

The concept of Rugby Safe is that it is basically an umbrella role that oversees and encompasses various roles already in place, but in a coherent and cohesive manner. As a result, the previously named golden role "Medical Officer" on GMS has now been renamed "RugbySafe Lead", this is to align with and increase the awareness of the RugbySafe campaign and reflect the wider player welfare remit that is evolving in the game and clubs may want to consider. All clubs must now have a RugbySafe point of contact.
